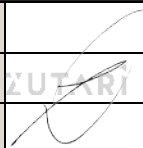

ENVIRONMENTAL AUTHORISATION FOR AN ENVIRONMENTAL MAINTENANCE MANAGEMENT PLAN (eMMP) FOR THE LOWER SUNDAYS RIVER WATER USERS ASSOCIATION (LSRWUA), EASTERN CAPE

Application to be submitted

1 Introduction

The purpose of this document is to provide the competent authority (CA) with relevant information for possible deviations to the public participation processes in order to fulfil the requirements of Chapter 6 in the National Environmental Management Act (NEMA) EIA Regulations 2014. This document was requested by the CA during the pre-application meeting, as the scale of the project and numerous landowners require a deviation from the standard public participation requirements. The specific measures recommended have been carefully considered to ensure that the process is transparent and inclusive to all Interested & Affected Parties (I&APs), whilst legally compliant.

2 Project description

In order to ensure an adequate and reliable supply of water, one of the duties of the Lower Sundays River Water Users Association (LSRWUA) is to maintain the canal infrastructure and system in a working order. Some of the maintenance and associated activities, required for the upkeep of the canals, may trigger the need for an EIA process as regulated by the EIA Regulations 2014. Given the extended footprint and locality of the existing infrastructure, this may require multiple applications in terms of the EIA process. In order to avoid repeated future applications for authorisation, LSRWUA thus appointed Zutari (Pty) Ltd to compile an Environmental Maintenance Management Plan (eMMP) to obtain an environmental authorisation for all future maintenance work on existing canal infrastructure under control of LSRWUA. This eMMP will be subjected to an environmental authorisation process in the form of a Basic Assessment as defined in the NEMA 2014 regulations.

3 Location

The eMMP is applicable to the approximately 290km of existing canal infrastructure operated and managed by LSRWUA within the Sundays River Valley. The canal infrastructure starts from Korhaans Drift weir and runs east through Kirkwood towards the Addo Elephant National Park. At the R335 it veers south through the town of Addo and ends downstream of the Barkley Bridge, where it discharges the remaining water back into the Sundays River. The canal infrastructure runs through numerous private and state-owned properties.

4 Public participation plan

The public participation process will be undertaken in accordance with the requirements of Regulations 39 to 44 of the Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Regulations, 2014, as amended, (GNR 326). The aim of the public participation process is primarily to ensure that:

- Information containing all relevant facts in respect of the proposed project is made available to potential stakeholders and I&APs
- Participation by I&APs is facilitated in such a manner that all potential stakeholders and I&APs are provided with a reasonable opportunity to comment on the proposed project
- Comments received from potential stakeholders and I&APs are recorded and incorporated into the EIA process.

The public participation plan, as set out in the table below, has been drafted for the above-mentioned project to ensure that reasonable opportunity is provided to I&APs and that all administrative actions are reasonable and acceptable. Proof of all notifications will be included in the public participation appendix included in the Basic Assessment report(s).

The public participation plan is submitted to DEDEAT for discussion and agreement before the public participation process is undertaken for the proposed project.

Regulation 40(2) - Provide access to all project information that has the potential to influence any decision regarding the application, unless protected by law, and must include consultation with Competent Authority, Organs of State & registered I&APs. Regulation 41(6) – Relevant information available and accessible.	<u>Provision of project information and consultation via various means including:</u> • Email correspondence • Instant messaging (SMS and/or WhatsApp) • Telephonic and MS Teams consultation • Communities will be consulted via the relevant Ward Councillor, ward committee members, community representative or local community forum members, as determined and confirmed during the consultation process. <u>Public meeting:</u> The need for a public meeting will be determined by the response received in the initial public participation phase. At this stage, communication via the WhatsApp channels will be most effective considering the large area that the project will cover. Should there be a need, and based on the comments raised, a public meeting will be considered. Communication will be provided in a language preferable to the community. Zutari will liaise with the Ward Councillor and LSRWUA regarding vulnerable and marginalised communities. Zutari will inform the Ward Councillor regarding the proposed project and will provide the Ward Councillor with an electronic notification as well as a WhatsApp notification. The WhatsApp notification will be distributed to the various community groups. All responses from these groups will be consolidated and sent back to Zutari for a response.
Regulation 41(2)(a) – Site notice.	• Erecting site notices at all affected properties is unfeasible due to the large number of properties involved. This would create significant logistical challenges, including difficulties in ensuring accessibility across the area. • Site notices will be erected on the relevant access roads to the Lower Sundays River Valley. Regulation 41(2)(c) – (e) – Advertisements.	Placing advertisements in a newspaper is not feasible, as the community does not have a formalized newspaper, and printed media has mostly been discontinued. As an alternative, electronic correspondence is proposed. LSRWUA and other identified civic organizations have extensive electronic communication networks. These are more likely to reach a larger audience, ensuring broader dissemination of information and promoting greater community engagement. This method is more accessible and effective for reaching stakeholders in this area.

Regulation 44 – Comments to be recorded.	- Written comments can be submitted via email - Any comments provided telephonically/via MS Teams or instant messaging, will be transcribed and recorded as formal comments - All comments received throughout the EIA process will be acknowledged and captured with a relevant response - The comments and responses will be included in the final report submitted to the Competent Authority.
Regulation 4(2) – Notification of decision on application.	<u>Notification of Environmental Authorisation (EA) using the following means:</u> All I&APs on the database will receive an email or WhatsApp notification of the decision made by DEDEAT. A copy of the decision will be circulated to registered I&APs.

5 Conclusion

The public participation plan will afford all potential and / or registered Interested and Affected Parties, including the competent authority and any other stakeholder or organ of state, an opportunity to become involved in the basic environmental impact assessment and provide comments during the various phases of the project. Zutari will ensure that reasonable opportunity is provided for public participation and that all administrative actions are reasonable.

PROJECT BACKGROUND

The Lower Sundays River Water User Association (LSRWUA) oversees the distribution and use of water for a number of users, including the Nelson Mandela Bay Municipality. In order to ensure an adequate and reliable supply of water one of the duties of the LSRWUA is to maintain the canal infrastructure system in working order. The maintenance and associated repairs required for the upkeep of the canals may require environmental authorisation as per the National Environmental Management Act, NEMA (No 107 of 1998). In order to avoid repeated future applications for authorisation LSRWUA thus appointed Zutari (Pty) Ltd to compile an

Environmental Maintenance Management Plan (eMMP) to obtain an environmental authorisation for all future maintenance work on existing canal infrastructure in the Sundays River Valley. This eMMP will be subjected to an environmental authorisation process in the form of a Basic Assessment as defined in the NEMA 2014 regulations.

PROJECT LOCATION

The eMMP applies to the approximately 290km of existing canal infrastructure operated and managed by LSRWUA within the Sundays River Valley. The canal infrastructure starts from Korhaans Drift weir and runs east through Kirkwood towards the Addo Elephant National Park until the canal system heads in a southerly direction towards Colchester. The system ends downstream of the Barkley Bridge, where it discharges remaining water back into the Sundays River.

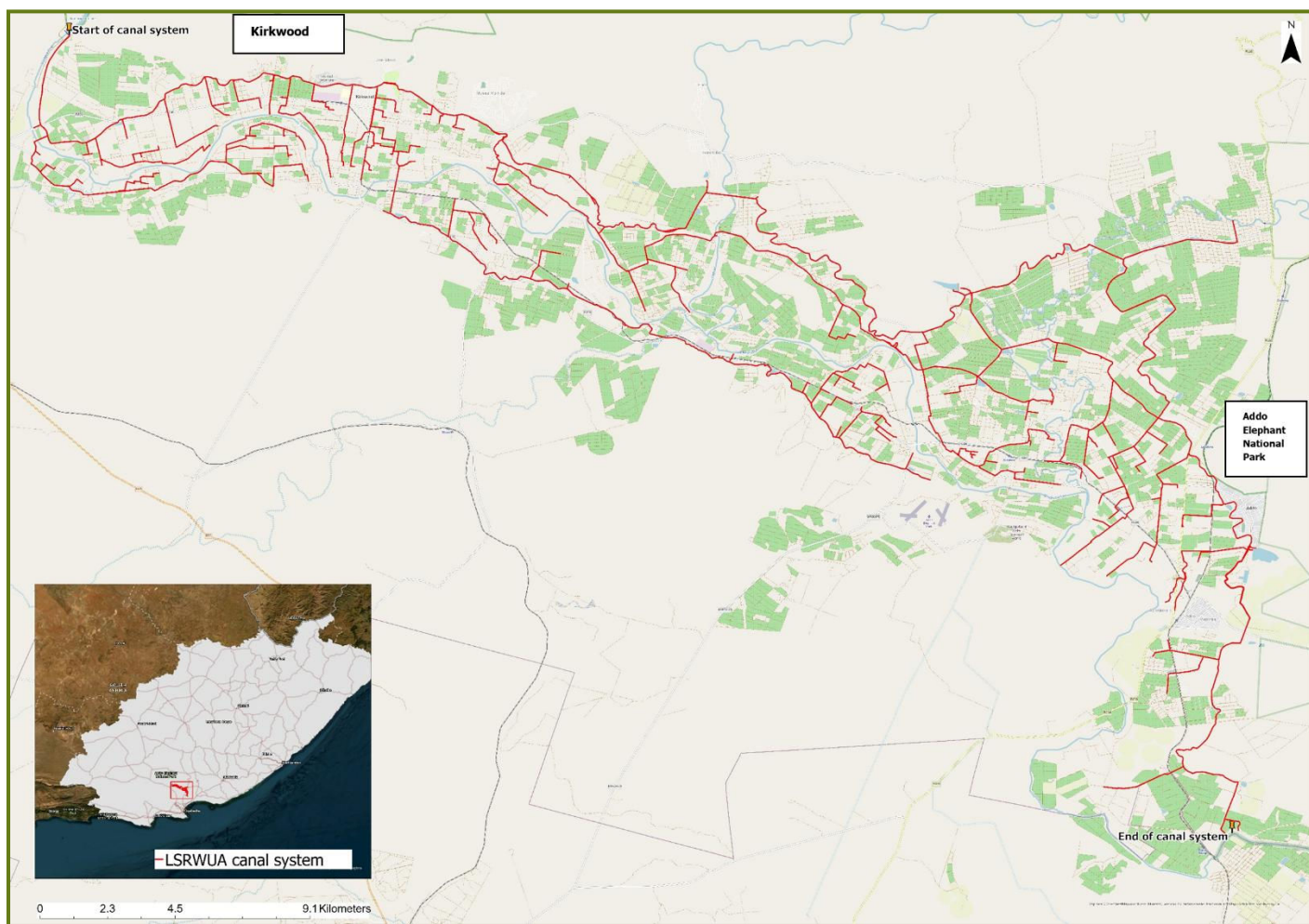


Figure 1. General locality of existing canal infrastructure

PROJECT ACTIVITY

The aim of the eMMP is to obtain authorisation in terms of the NEMA 2014 regulations for all the planning, construction, operational and rehabilitation activities for the maintenance and replacement of existing canal

infrastructure and services under LSRWUA jurisdiction. Therefore, a public participation process is being carried out as part of the authorisation application procedures.

LEGAL REQUIREMENTS

The proposed eMMP requires environmental approval before it may proceed, and the following legal requirements are triggered:

National Environmental Management Act (NEMA) (No. 107 of 1998) – The Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Regulations of 2014 (as amended), identify certain activities which “could have a substantial detrimental effect on the environment” and which therefore require authorisation from the relevant environmental authority before they may proceed. The proposed maintenance potentially triggers a number these activities, and application for environmental authorisation is thus being made to the relevant environmental authority i.e. the provincial Department of Economic Development, Environmental Affairs and Tourism (DEDEAT) Sarah Baartman region. A basic environmental assessment process will be followed.

National Water Act (NWA) (No. 36 of 1998) - Maintenance activities are likely to involve work within the regulated area of a watercourse and application for a Water Use Licence in terms of the National Water Act will thus be required. Water uses to be applied for are S21(c) and S21(i), i.e. “*impeding or diverting flow in a watercourse*”; and “*altering, impacting or disturbing the bed, banks and/or flow of a watercourse*” respectively. The Department of Water and Sanitation (DWS) will be included in the Public Participation Process as a Commenting Authority and an Interested & Affected Party and they will advise on the way forward.

National Environmental: Biodiversity Management Act (NEM:BA) (No.10 of 2004) – The provisions of this Act may potentially be triggered if the removal or destruction of protected species and management of alien invasive species in the proposed area is required. A servitude is maintained along the canal which makes this unlikely.

National Heritage Resources Act (NHRA) (No. 25 of 1999) - Section 38(1) (c) may be applicable to this project. Although a heritage authorization is unlikely as areas were previously disturbed, the Eastern Cape Provincial Heritage Resources Authority (ECPHRA), would determine whether a Heritage Impact Assessment is required.

THE BASIC ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT PROCESS

The purpose of the basic assessment is to identify and describe potential positive and negative environmental impacts associated with the proposed project and its feasible alternatives, and to investigate and assess those alternatives and impacts. A simplified flow chart of the process is shown below.

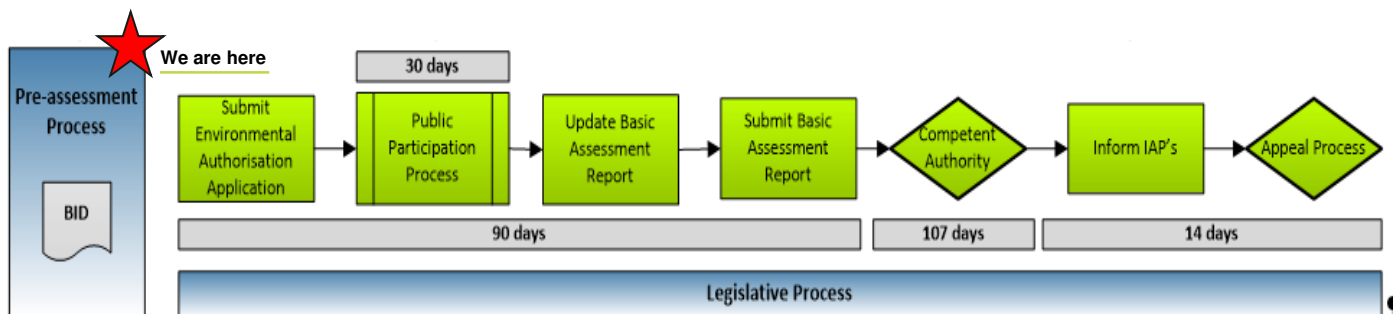


Figure2: Basic Assessment Process (2014 EIA regulations, as amended)

Stakeholder engagement is a key component of the environmental assessment process, and is incorporated in the following stages:

- Pre-application stakeholder notification (adverts, notices, this BID document) with provision of a 30-day comment/registration period.
- Providing all registered I&APs with a 30-day opportunity to comment on the Draft Basic Assessment Report (DBAR).
- Incorporating all I&AP comments into the final Basic Assessment Report.
- Informing stakeholders of the decision taken by DEDEAT to approve or not approve the project and of the opportunity for appeal.

A registration form is provided on the following page. Alternatively, you may email us directly, but please ensure that you provide all of the information required in the form.

- a) Comments must be submitted within the approved timeframes (30 days) or within any extension of a timeframe agreed to by the applicant or EAP;
- b) Any direct business, financial, personal or other interest which that party may have in the approval or refusal of the application must be disclosed.

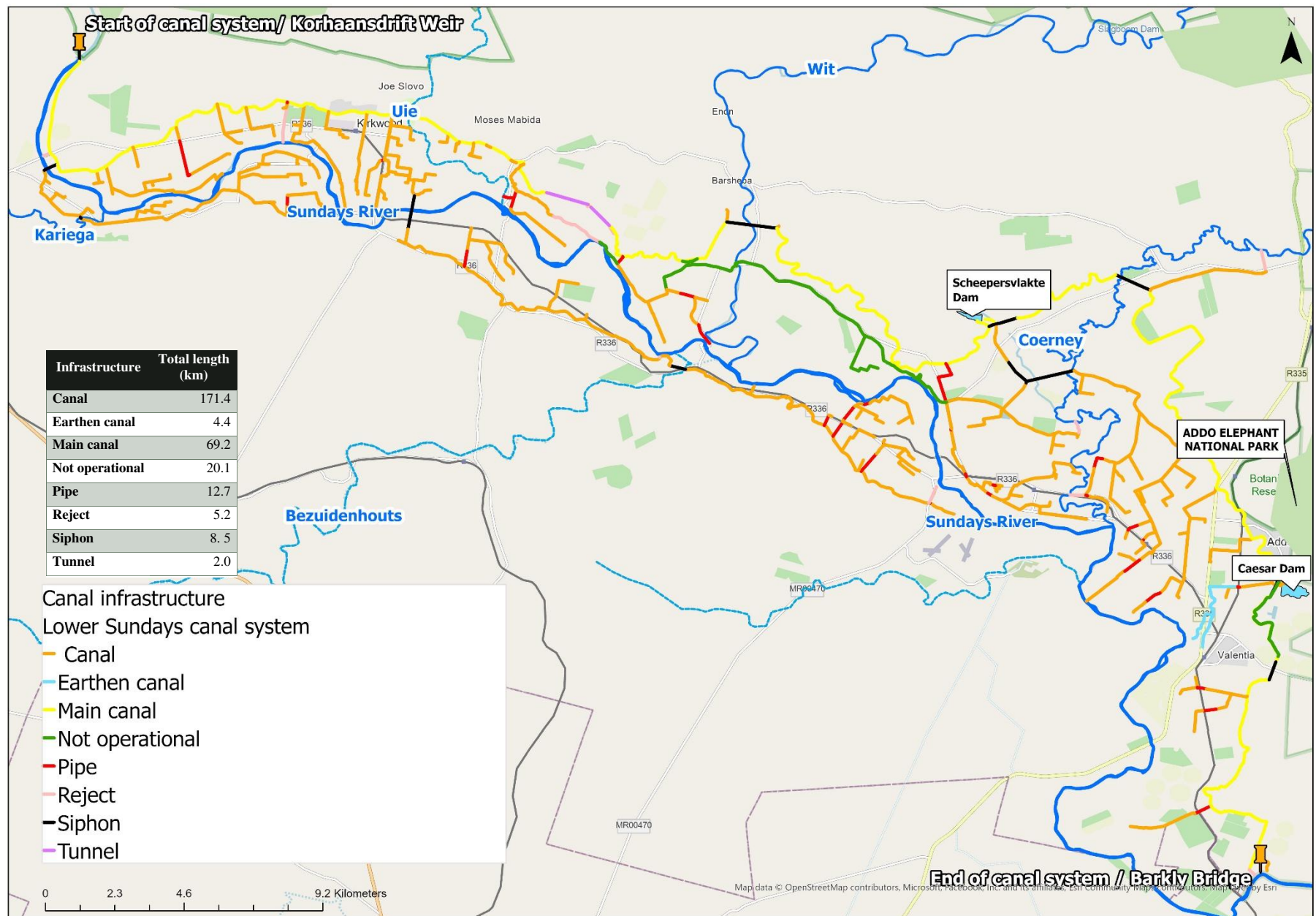
